RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE MAYOR

The Mayor shall have full charge and control of the Chief of Police and the police force; and shall direct the time during which, the place where, and the manner in which the Chief of Police and the police force perform the duties of their rank.



The primary responsibility of the Mayor is to effectively preserve the public peace within the Borough. Other responsibilities include presiding over the organization of the council until it is organized (as provided in Section 1001, Title 8 of the PA Consolidated Statues), casting a tie or split breaking vote, performing marriage ceremonies, requesting aide and assistance from law enforcement officers and agencies, declaring a state of emergency, and administering oaths.

9-1-1, ONE CALL DOES IT ALL

If you have a need for service from Police, Fire, or EMS, 9-1-1 is the only number you need.

All too common the public feels that 9-1-1 is used for emergencies only, or it is faster to receive service to call the station directly. The fact is that 9-1-1 is provided for any emergency service matters. If you need to report an incident that happened after a significant delay, such as vandalism that was discovered, or possibly you discovered you are the victim of identity theft call 9-1-1.



You will receive a fast police response if you utilize 9-1-1. When calling the station 10-digit phone number the information gets collected and sent to 9-1-1 dispatch resulting in delays. Speaking directly to dispatchers is the most efficient process.

TIPS FOR CALLING 9-1-1

- 1. Location: Provide the best available location (address, intersection, landmark)
- 2. Nature of Service: Type of crime, or service needed
- 3. Description: General to specific. For example:
 - a. Vehicle: Red pickup truck, Ford F150, newer model, tinted windows
 - b. Person: White male, medium build, 25-35, light colored shirt, dark pants
 - 4. Caller Information

PAL PARTNERSHIP NORRISTOWN POLICE ATHLETIC LEAGUE

Since 1976, Greater Norristown PAL (GNPAL) has served thousands of area youth in a variety of programs. Conshohocken Police have been involved since October 2016. Officer Glasgow visits GNPAL on a regular basis, on his personal time, to assist staff and interact with the children. Officer Glasgow spends time



at PAL playing basketball with the kids, participating in youth group discussions, serves as a bystander in the boxing gym, and participates in cultural and community activities. The participation in community sponsored events at PAL include, but are not limited to; local Job Fair, Basketball Camp(Summer '17), Black History Month program, a recent college fair, and the Norristown Youth Rally. Officer Glasgow also participated in PAL's annual clothing drive charity event called the "Love Exchange." This event is held the Saturday before Thanksgiving to assist Norristown's community by donating clothing to disadvantage citizens. Officer Glasgow solicited clothing

donations for the charity event and delivered them to event organizers at the Gotwals Elementary School. When programs and events at PAL are announced, the information will be posted on Conshohocken Police Department's Facebook page and website for youths and adults in Conshohocken to participate.

TRAINING SIMULATOR

In June 2017, the Conshohocken Police Department acquired a Ti Training Use of Force Training Simulator. The Ti Training device is a multimedia tool that exposes officers to scenarios where the focus is on de-escalation and escalation force options and also aids the officers in marksmanship techniques.

FIRE PREVENTION WEEK OCTOBER 8TH - 14TH

FIRE PREVENTION REMINDERS

- Install smoke alarms on every level of your home, inside bedrooms and outside sleeping areas. ٠
- Test smoke and carbon monoxide detectors once a month.
- Talk with all family members about a fire escape plan and practice the plan twice a year.
- If a fire occurs in your home, GET OUT, STAY OUT and CALL 911. •
- Practice STOP, DROP and ROLL.
- Keep anything that can catch fire oven mitts, wooden utensils, food packaging, towels or curtains, away • from your stovetop.
- Make sure you clean the lint filter before or after each load of laundry.
- Have a meeting place outside the residence, so everyone can be accounted for.

SMOKE AND CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTORS

- Install smoke alarms inside and outside each bedroom and sleeping area. Install alarms on every level of the home. Install alarms in the basement.
- Test all smoke alarms at least once a month. •
- Carbon Monoxide detectors should be installed on every level, on the ceiling by stairwells.
- If the Carbon Monoxide alarm sounds, immediately move to a fresh air location outdoors. Make sure everyone inside the home is • accounted for. Call 911 from a fresh air location and stay there until emergency personnel arrive.
- Gas or charcoal grills, and generators produce Carbon Monoxide they are for outside use only.



HEATER SAFETY

- Have heating equipment and chimneys cleaned and inspected every year by a qualified professional.
- Keep anything that can burn at least five-feet away from heating equipment, like the furnace, fireplace, wood stove, or portable space heater.
- Space heaters should be turned off and unplugged when you leave the room or go to bed.
- If you smell Natural Gas inside your residence, move to fresh air location and call 911.


WOOD BURNING STOVES & FIREPLACES

- Make sure the fireplace has a sturdy screen to stop sparks from flying into the room.
- Ashes should be cool before putting them in a metal container. Keep the container a safe distance away from your home.
- Have your chimney and stove inspected and cleaned by a certified chimney sweep every fall just before heating season.
- Backyard fire pits must be kept 15 feet away from any combustible material. Make sure smoke from fire pits and chimneys do not make a nuisance to your neighbors.

CANDLES & HOLIDAY DECORATIONS

- Use a battery-operated candle or glow-stick in jack-o-lanterns.
- Never use lit candles to decorate the tree.
- Always turn off Christmas tree lights before leaving home or going to bed.

ENGINEERING, LICENSES & INSPECTIONS


The Engineering, Licenses & Inspections Department personnel work diligently to preserve and protect the health, safety, and welfare of the public throughout all facets of property ownership, residency, development, construction, and business operation within Conshohocken Borough. The E,L & I Department is responsible to promote proactive property maintenance and regulate business activities through the issuance of permits, licenses and certificates, and conducting appropriate inspections to ensure compliance with applicable ordinances and codes adopted by the Borough. The Director of Engineering, Licenses & Inspections, Paul W. Hughes, PE, serves as the lead administrator for the Engineering, Licenses & Inspections Department.

PROPERTY MAINTENANCE & SAFETY:

The E,L & I staff are working tirelessly to promote proactive property maintenance and keep the public rights-of-way safe and passable for both pedestrians and motorists. Property owners are required by Borough Ordinance to maintain elements of their respective properties in a safe and code compliant manner. The Borough has adopted the 2012 International Property Maintenance Code to govern the parameters by which basic property maintenance is enforced. The Borough's code enforcement officers are charged with notifying and educating property owners about these responsibilities, and to protect the health, safety and welfare of the public.

CONSHOHOCKEN BOROUGH MS4 – STORMWATER MANAGEMENT:

All Borough property owners and residents need to do their part to prevent contamination of stormwater runoff which may be harmful to the environment of Conshohocken and downstream waterways including Plymouth Creek, the Schuylkill River, the Delaware River and Bay, and even the Atlantic Ocean. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

FAIR HOUSING FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES



Do you have a physical, mental or emotional condition, which limits one or more activities of daily living? Do you use a walker, wheelchair, service animal, or a personal care attendant? Do you rent your dwelling? If so, you are protected under the Fair Housing Amendments Act of 1968 as amended.

The Fair Housing Act prohibits discrimination in the sale or rental of housing. Illegal practices include refusing to sell or rent to someone with a disability; refusal to negotiate for housing; making housing unavailable or telling a prospective renter or buyer that housing is not available; discriminatory advertising; and threatening anyone exercising their fair housing rights or anyone who assists someone who is exercising their fair housing rights. Additionally and most importantly for an individual with disabilities, it is illegal to refuse to make reasonable

accommodations for individuals with disabilities or to refuse to permit a tenant with a disability to make reasonable modifications to their home at their own expense.

Reasonable accommodations are changes to rules, policies, or general services that enable a person with a disability to fully use and enjoy their home. Examples of such accommodations would be assigning a mail box on the lowest level of boxes to a person who uses a wheelchair; allowing individuals with assistive animals to have the animal where there is a no pet policy, not charging a fee for an assistive animal that is not charged to all other animal owners; or assigning parking spaces in close proximity to the entrance to a building or the elevator in a building for individuals who have difficulty walking.

People with disabilities have the right to make reasonable modifications to their dwelling to enable them to use the dwelling's features appropriately. For example, an individual may require grab bars to use the bathroom facilities; lower cabinets or sinks may be needed in the kitchen by an individual using a wheelchair; a ramp may be needed to access a building or a laundry room; or a deaf individual may require a lighted doorbell to know when there is someone at the door. In most instances the tenant of the unit is required to pay for the modifications, unless the building receives federal assistance. Also, the disabled individual may be required to remove the modifications and return the unit to its original condition, when they move.

If you think you have been discriminated in housing including being refused a reasonable accommodation or modification, contact Conshohocken's Human Relation Commission through the Borough Administration Office, 610-828-1092, or the Housing Equality Center of Pennsylvania at 866-540-FAIR (3247).



NEW HOUSING REHABILITATION INCOME GUIDELINES

The U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has issued new income eligibility guidelines for Conshohocken's Housing Rehabilitation Program. Conshohocken's Housing Rehabilitation Program provides services to low and moderate income residents to bring their properties into compliance with the local building code and established housing quality standards.

Eligible repairs include: roof repair, window repair or replacement, heater replacement, electrical upgrades, plumbing improvements, kitchen improvements, accessibility improvements, exterior concrete, and other repairs that are not solely aesthetic in nature, such as general painting of a house.

1 Person Household	\$ 46,600	
2 Person Household	\$ 53,250	
3 Person Household	\$ 59,900	
4 Person Household	\$ 66,550	
There are further increases in income limits based on additional family members.		

The Housing Rehabilitation Program provides one-time assistance only. If the program has provided services in the past, additional work on the same property is not permitted.


ASH TREE TREATMENT IN SUTCLIFFE PARK

In early June 2017 the Public Services Department identified 21 ash trees within Sutcliffe Park. After inspection it was determined that the trees showed signs of damage from being infested with the Emerald Ash Borer.

What is the Emerald Ash Borer?

The emerald ash borer is a half-inch long metallic green beetle with the scientific name Agrilus planipennis fairmaire. Larvae of this beetle feed under the bark of ash trees. Their feeding eventually girdles and kills branches and entire trees. Emerald ash borer was first identified in North America in southeastern Michigan in 2002. In the years since that discovery, the beetle has spread into Minnesota, Wisconsin, Indiana, Illinois, Iowa, Kansas, Missouri, Kentucky, Tennessee, Ohio, Maryland, Virginia, West Virginia, Pennsylvania, New York, Massachusetts, Connecticut, New Hampshire, North Carolina, Ontario and Quebec.

Emerald ash borer feeds exclusively on ash trees in North America. Host species include green ash, white ash, black ash, blue ash, and pumpkin ash. Tens of millions of ash trees have been lost to this pest, which usually kills ash trees within 3-4 years of infestation. Symptoms of emerald ash borer infestation include upper crown dieback.





How we treated the ash trees?

The Ash Trees were treated with an insecticide called TREE-äge G4, using the Arborjet trunk injection system. Several employees of the Public Services Department received training on the injection system. After completing the training, treatment on the Ash trees began immediately. A measurement of the tree diameter was the first step. Once the measurement was taken the proper amount of tree injection sites can then be determined. A 1 ¹/₂" hole is drilled into the base of the tree for each injection site. Each tree varies in size and the amount of injections sites ranged from 8 to 17 per tree, with each injection site receiving 6 ml to 12 ml of insecticide. Each treatment to the Ash Trees will occur every two years for the next 10 years, when the EAB is projected to die out. This treatment plan will proactively help attempt to save the ash tree population in Conshohocken.

FALL LEAF COLLECTION

Every year the Public Services Department collects leaves beginning in October and ending in December. The schedule will be posted 🔒 on the Borough's website just prior to the start.

- The leaf pile may extend along the length of your entire property. Please rake your piles to the curb but not into the street.
- Please do not mix limbs, brush, and other debris in the leaf piles. This may result in damage to equipment and injuries to employees.
- · Adverse weather conditions may cause delays on posted leaf collection dates.
- Once the leaf collecting machine passes it will NOT return.
- Leaves will not be collected in the trash. Trash with leaves commingled will not be collected.
- Motorists should obey the posted 'no parking' signs and be cautious on all roads during leaf collection season.



CHRISTMAS TREE RECYCLING

Conshohocken Borough will start recycling Christmas trees on **Wednesday**, **December 27**, **2017**. Residents are asked to put their used Christmas trees out on Tuesday before the Wednesday yard waste pick-up. Residents must remove tree bags, all ornaments, lights and stands. The trees are collected, chipped and composted. The Borough thanks you for your cooperation.



SNOW REMOVAL

When it snows it is the Public Services Department's goal to have all Borough and State roads cleared within 6 to 10 hours after the snow has stopped falling. If you have off street parking please refrain from parking on the street. This will help our crews do a better job. Clear your sidewalks after plowing has been completed. A 3 foot wide path of sidewalk must be cleared on your property within 24 hours after the snow has stopped. Don't forget your cross walks and alley crossing.

It is illegal, to shovel, throw or plow snow from sidewalks onto street parking, driveways and allies into the street or right-of way. Dumping snow or ice on Borough property, or plowing snow across a street is also prohibited.

When a snow emergency has been declared by the Mayor, remember to remove your vehicle from any posted "Snow Emergency Route." Your vehicles must be removed until after the parking lanes have been completely cleared.

2017/2018 HOLIDAY SOLID WASTE & RECYCLE COLLECTION SCHEDULE

- When a Holiday falls on a Saturday or a Sunday it is observed on the following Monday.
- When your trash and recycle collection day falls on a holiday, your trash and recyclables will be collected on your next scheduled collection day.
- If the holiday is on a Monday there will be no trash collection. Trash for the West Side and recyclables only for the East Side will be picked up on Tuesday following the Monday holiday.

PUBLIC SERVICES

TRASH COLLECTION RULES AND REGULATIONS

- There is a limit of 4 cans/bags per household per pick-up (200 pounds maximum)
- Each can/bag is not to be heavier than **50 pounds**.
- Needles, syringes, lances and other sharp objects should be placed in a metal container with a secure lid so as not to be a hazard.
- Please place your cans/bags at curbside on your property **no earlier than 5:00PM** the night before and your cans must be removed from curbside **no later than 7:00PM** the day of collection.
- No clean-outs or move-outs unless prearranged **24 hours in advance**... Please call 610-828-1092.
- No construction debris or carpet unless prearranged **24 hours in advance**... Please call 610-828-1092.
- Trash will be left curb side and 'red tagged' if deemed to be **too heavy or improperly placed**. Trash that is left should be returned to the property before 7:00 PM.

YARD WASTE COLLECTION EVERY WEDNESDAY

All residences **must participate** in the Borough's recycling programs by separating their recyclable material from their regular trash. Yard waste is recyclable, therefore the separation and collection of this material is mandated by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and Conshohocken Borough.

- Grass clippings, weeds, leaves, brush and plants should be placed in **biodegradable paper composting bags**. Please no trash in these bags.
- Each bag should not to be heavier than **50 pounds**.
- Tree branches under five-(5") in diameter, not exceeding five-(5') in length, are to be securely tied into bundles and should not to be heaver then **50 pounds**.
- · Christmas trees should not have decorations, tree stands or plastic tree bags.
- Please place your bags and or bundles at curbside on your property no earlier than 5:00 PM the night before.
- There is **no limit of yard waste** collected that is determined to be reasonable by the borough.
