

## A NEW POCKET PARK IS COMING TO THE BOROUGH IN 2025!

The Raymond Ludwig Weinmann Sr. Memorial Park will be nestled between the Schuylkill River Trail and The Tomato Shack on the corner of Harry Street and Stoddard Avenue.

Weinmann Park will feature benches on a short pathway that cuts through the park, greenery (including bushes, shrubs, and small trees), and bike racks. With its proximity to the SEPTA Train Station and the Conshohocken Cab stop at The Birch, Weinmann Park will be an ideal spot to wait for your train or the Conshohocken Cab.

This will be the second pocket park in the Borough of Conshohocken, joining the Fritz Lodge Pocket Park that was completed in 2023. The pocket parks will help increase the walkability of the Borough and also preserve and enhance the Borough's green infrastructure.

## **MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR**



One of the questions I am most frequently asked when I speak with Cub Scouts, Girl Scouts, Conshohocken Elementary students, and even many residents is, "What does a Mayor do? Aren't you the boss?"

While our Borough Council members have specific duties set out in the Pennsylvania Borough Code-including attending Borough Council meetings, creating ordinances, and

setting the budget each year--the position of Mayor is much more nebulous, with few legal requirements but many suggested roles (including attending Borough Council meetings!).

Here is a roundup of some of these roles and responsibilities. I would describe them less as being "the boss" and more as community engagement, public safety, and bringing fun and positivity to Conshohocken!

#### Supervision of the Conshohocken Police Department



One of the specific and most important roles in the Borough Code is overseeing the Conshohocken Police Department. This means regular checkins and meetings with our Chief of Police, ensuring resident safety concerns reach the department, and advocating for safety measures, such as new stop signs, traffic lights, safety bollards, and road markings.

I also love attending community events

with our officers, such as talking to students at Conshohocken Elementary, reading books at the Conshohocken Library, Drug Take Backs at Borough Hall, and our recent food drive at Weis.

#### **Emergency Declarations**


On my second day in office, I declared a Snow Emergency. I thought this would be a very regular duty, but in the years after, I have only issued two or three in total! A Snow Emergency ensures that Public Services is able to clear the roads during heavy snowstorms by restricting parking on a few key roads, such as Fayette Street.

I also signed Emergency Declarations during the pandemic and Hurricane Ida to ensure any resources we used during those events would be eligible for reimbursement from state and federal agencies.

### Weddings

This is probably the most fun duty that I have! I love seeing couples that I have married all over town. I have married residents in many different circumstances, such as through glass mailroom doors during the pandemic, to 250+ in-person weddings, and everything



### Working with Borough Council

We are lucky to have seven dedicated public servants working for each ward and the Borough as a whole. In my role as Mayor, I bring council members ideas and concerns that I hear from you, my thoughts on items coming before them, and advocacy on public safety issues in particular.

This strong relationship culminated recently with our nationwide search for a new police chief where Council, myself, and our professional staff were able to vet dozens of candidates, interview, and finally hire Chief Lennon this past January, a true team effort.

#### **Community Events**

Planning community events is another one of my favorite mayoral duties. My wife and I organize the Conshohocken Arts Festival and Car Show on the first Saturday of every June and Conshy Strong Bingo in August,



and I work with our police department to run regular events such as Community Document Shredding in the fall, Bike and Trail Safety classes, Hands-Only CPR, Identity Theft Protection, and Coffee with a Cop.

I encourage you to follow my social media and newsletter for those dates and details as they come up throughout the year, and even submit events so that I can help advertise to the community.

## Pet Waste, Know Where it Goes - Take Simple Steps to Reduce Stormwater Pollution!

Left behind pet waste is more than a nightmare for our shoes. There's another important reason to scoop the poop that isn't as well known: preventing pollution in our rivers! It might not seem like a stormwater problem, but pet waste is one of the many seemingly small sources of pollution that can add to big problems for water quality and even human health.

Pet waste doesn't just decompose. When pet waste is left on the ground, rainwater or melting snow breaks it down and washes it into storm drains or directly into the Plymouth Creek or Schuylkill River. This contaminated water contains disease-causing bacteria, which is unsafe for everyone and causes larger environmental issues. Pet waste increases algae blooms and excessive aquatic plant growth, which can rob the water of vital oxygen for fish and other animals to live.

How can you help?

- Carry a bag with you on every walk with your dog, and you'll have the equipment to remove your dog's waste. Then throw it in a trash can, and you're done! Even if you're using biodegradable bags, throw them in a trash can when the bag breaks down, the waste is left behind, thus defeating the purpose of bagging the waste if not thrown in the trash. If you prefer not to use bags, you can use gloves, newspaper, or even a scooper to pick it up and flush unbagged pet waste down the toilet.
- It's also a good idea to pick up pet waste at home. Picking it up sooner rather than later will prevent it being carried off by rain or snow melt. Some diseases can be transmitted from pet

waste to humans through contact with the soil. Children playing outside and adults who garden are most at risk.




- It's important to properly dispose of the
- waste of dogs, cats, and other pets that eat meat. Waste from meat eaters should not be placed in a compost pile because parasites, bacteria, and viruses are not readily destroyed during the composting process and can be passed on to humans.
- Never throw pet waste into a storm drain.

It's important to keep in mind that the public storm sewer system does not get treated - anything that enters the Borough's storm sewer system will eventually reach the Plymouth Creek or Schuylkill River. In addition to picking up pet waste, some easy things you can do every day to help protect water quality include:

- Mulch lawn clippings back into the lawn to provide natural fertilizer
- Reduce the use of fertilizers and pesticides on lawns and gardens
- · Keep leaves and grass out of storm drains
- Store and dispose of any hazardous products properly
- Place litter in trash receptacles

If you notice water flowing in the public storm sewer system during times of dry weather, this is a potential sign of a problem. Please report any concerns to Conshohocken Borough at 610-828-1092 or by using the reporting form on the Borough's Stormwater Management webpage:

## **ZONING SERVICES**

The rules for each zoning district are outlined in the Borough's Zoning Ordinance, which determines the specific land uses that are permitted in each district, such as residential, office, commercial, or industrial. The code also outlines the dimensional standards in each district, such as maximum building and impervious coverage, minimum building setbacks, and maximum building heights.

### **Zoning Permits**

The Zoning Ordinance includes regulations governing off-street parking, patios, walkways, signs, fences, and accessory structures. Please note the above mentioned require zoning permits.

The application for a Zoning Permit can be found on the Borough's website, www.conshohockenpa.gov. The permit fee is a flat fee of \$50.00, and permits require two weeks to process for completed applications.

### **Zoning Hearing Board Applications**

The Zoning Hearing Board conducts public hearings at the request of developers and residents seeking zoning relief from a provision of the Zoning Ordinance via variance or special exception. The Board meets when an application and/or zoning petition has been submitted with all applicable documentation and fees. The Zoning Hearing Board reviews applications on a case-by-case basis and makes determinations based on the Borough's Zoning Ordinance.

Meeting dates, changes, and/or cancellations are reflected on the Borough's website.

### Adoption of the Fayette Street Overlay District (FCO) Ordinance

In 2023, Borough Council created a Main Street Overlay Task Force, comprised of elected officials, Borough staff, community members, and volunteers to review the Borough's Zoning Ordinance and make recommendations regarding amendments to effectuate the Borough's comprehensive plan and to encourage appropriate development/redevelopment of the Borough's Main Street Corridor, located along Fayette Street in the Borough. The Task Force recommended certain changes to the Borough's Zoning Ordinance and Zoning Map to create the FCO - Fayette Street Corridor Overlay District.

In February 2024, Borough Council adopted an ordinance that amended Chapter 27 of the Zoning Code by creating the Fayette Street Corridor Overlay District. The ordinance seeks to maintain the unique character along Fayette Street, while attracting new businesses and encouraging walkability in the Borough. The specific regulations proposed by the ordinance include:

- Various regulations to encourage dwelling units in combination with businesses as a mixed-use development.
- Provisions to provide incentives for the adaptive re-use of vacant, abandoned, or underutilized commercial properties.
- An update to parking regulations to ensure they are conducive to businesses and residents.

## HOUSING REHABILITATION PROGRAM

Conshohocken's Housing Rehabilitation Program has existed for over four decades and has assisted hundreds of Conshohocken homeowners in bringing their homes into code conformance, enabling them to live more comfortably and safely. On average, the Program completes four (4) to seven (7) properties a year.

The Program can provide eligible single-family homeowners with numerous upgrades including, but not limited to, roof repair, window and door replacement, electrical upgrades, plumbing upgrades, kitchen upgrades, sidewalk repair, and handicap accessibility.

The Program is a four-year deferred loan program that forgives one-quarter of the loan amount each year.

The Colonial School District resumed classes earlier than normal this year, with the first day of school being Tuesday, August 27. Please be mindful of the active school zone and school buses. Whether you're walking or driving, share equal respect. Safety is everyone's responsibility.

## Knowledge is key. Here are some laws that will help keep drivers and pedestrians safe:

- The driver must yield when a pedestrian crosses the street in a crosswalk.
- Drivers are not required to yield until a pedestrian begins to step into the crosswalk.
- Pedestrians should not walk or run unexpectedly into the path of a moving vehicle.
- Pedestrians should not assume drivers will see or yield. Look left, right, and left again before stepping out.
- It is illegal for drivers to pass a vehicle that is stopped for a pedestrian in a crosswalk, as the second driver may not see the pedestrian.
- When crossing the street at a signalized intersection, both pedestrians and motorists must obey the traffic-control devices.

### **Tips for Pedestrians:**

- Cross only at crosswalks. Do not cross between parked cars.
- · Look left, right, then left again, and keep looking.
- Wait for a gap in traffic, then step one foot off the curb or fully enter the crosswalk and make eye contact with the driver.
- Always obey traffic signs and signals. Be mindful of pedestrian countdown timers.

- See and be seen. Wear bright, reflective clothing.
- On streets with multiple lanes in each direction, be aware of what drivers in both near lanes are doing. If one driver allows you to cross, the other might not see you.

#### **Tips for Motorists:**

- Slow down when approaching a crosswalk or intersection. Watch for pedestrians and be prepared to yield to them.
- Yield to pedestrians in crosswalks—the law requires motorists to yield to pedestrians in crosswalks at signalized and non-signalized intersections.
- Travel at a prudent speed. Don't try to beat the light.
- Drivers on streets with multiple lanes in each direction should be aware that pedestrians may be crossing all lanes.

#### **Upcoming Community Events**

## SUTCLIFFE PARK PROJECT UPDATE

As you can see, work is well underway at Sutcliffe Park. The project has two parts: the reconstruction of the walking trail and stormwater management.

The walking trail has existed at Sutcliffe Park since 1998 and is a popular park feature. Weather and use of the trail have made it necessary to redo the trail's surface. In addition to replacing the walking surface:

- A new walking loop will be added around the baseball field closest to the parking area, making a more level-accessible walking area for older adults and people with disabilities.
- New access trails at West 9th Avenue and Colwell Lane will be added.
- Drainage along the trail will be improved.

• New signs will be installed showing the lengths of the trail and its various sections.

In addition to Borough funding, trail reconstruction is supported with grants from the Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources Bureau of Recreation and Conservation and the Commonwealth Financing Authority Greenways, Trails, and Recreation Program.

The stormwater management project is designed to reduce the discharge of pollutants from the public storm sewer system in order to protect water quality, to address the Borough's requirements of the Clean Water Act and Pennsylvania Clean Streams Law.

Make sure to check the Borough website for updates about estimated completion dates.

## **FIRE SERVICES**

The Fire Services Team works closely with Licensing & Inspections, Emergency Management, the Police Department, and Narberth Ambulance to further ensure the protection of life and property of our citizens, visitors, and businesses. The Borough of Conshohocken employs part-time firefighters and three full-time career firefighters, who also serve as the Borough's fire inspectors. Fire inspectors are tasked with performing annual inspections on fire alarms and fire protection systems in new and/or existing commercial buildings within the Borough of Conshohocken. State and local fire codes require that every business receive a regular fire inspection.

Fire Services for Conshohocken also consists of two volunteer fire stations, Washington Fire Company No. 1 and Conshohocken Fire Company No. 2. Both fire companies operate under station 55 and provide volunteer firefighting services to the Borough of Conshohocken.

#### Home & Fire Safety

The Conshohocken Fire Department has noticed an increase in electrical house fires due to misuse of power strips. It is important to use power strips correctly. Never use multiple extension cords in one outlet. Overloading outlets, circuits, and extension cords by plugging too many things into one area can cause an electrical fire.

#### Avoid potential fires by following these safety tips below:

- Check to ensure that all electrical cords are in good condition and are not broken or cut.
- Clean the lint from your dryer after every use.
- Check to see if all plug outlets are safe and do not feel warm when you touch them. If they are warm, call an electrician.

### **Free Smoke Detectors & Installation**

Free smoke detectors are available to property owners and may be picked up at Borough Hall (400 Fayette Street, Suite 200, Conshohocken, PA 19428). Supplies are limited to three (3) smoke detectors per household. Residents requiring special accommodations may arrange to have their smoke detectors

- Install carbon monoxide alarms on each level of your home.
- Make sure carbon monoxide alarms are less than 7 years old.

### **Fire Hydrant Clearance**

Ensure firefighters have access to fire hydrants at any time of the year. Wintry weather can create fire safety hazards, such as ice or heavy snowfall that can obstruct fire hydrants. You can help reduce the risk by keeping fire hydrants accessible and clear of ice and snow.

#### **Fire Prevention Education & Events**

Fire Services offers a variety of educational opportunities and events to spread awareness about fire safety. Conshohocken's Fire Services Team provides on-site fire safety education yearround to the community at no cost. We encourage schools and businesses within the Borough of Conshohocken to contact the Fire Chief to learn more, or to schedule an onsite visit today! Conshohocken partners with Plymouth and Whitemarsh Townships to host the annual Colonial Fire Prevention Expo. The event is held in October during Fire Prevention Week and rotates each year among the Borough of Conshohocken, Plymouth, and Whitemarsh Townships. The night is full of fun, interactive and educational displays, including vehicle, water, and high angle rescue demonstrations. Event information is announced on the Borough's website under News and posted to the Borough's social media pages.

## Trash & Recycling Cart Updates

Borough-approved containers must be used for all residential trash and recycling unless other arrangements have been made and approved by the Public Services Department. Trash and recycling cans must have 2 wheels, a metal life bar, and attached lid. Unapproved containers will be tagged for no future pickups until the residence comes into compliance.

## Trash Collection Rules and Regulations

- There is a limit of four (4) cans/bags per household per pick-up (200 pounds maximum)
- Each can/bag is not to be heavier than 50 pounds.
- Needles, syringes, lances, and other sharp objects should be placed in a metal container with a secure lid so as not to be a hazard.
- Each household is permitted to dispose of one (1) large piece of furniture or bulk item per month with regular trash. This includes sofas, box springs, plastic siding, TVs and all electronics. All other bulk trash or bulk metal collection must be arranged through the Borough of Conshohocken by calling 610-828-1092.
- Please place your cans/bags at curbside on your property no earlier than 5:00 PM the night before and your cans must be removed from curbside no later than 7:00 PM the day of collection.
- No construction debris, carpet, clean-outs, or move-outs unless approved by the Licenses and Inspections Department. Please call 610-828-1092.

## **Conshohocken Is Single Stream Recycling**

Single stream recycling allows all your recyclable materials to be placed into one recycling container. The best part is you do not have to separate them! Hence, we get the term '*Single Stream Recycling.*' Residents will see trash trucks collecting recyclables. Rest assured recycled materials will go to the recycling facility, NOT the trash-to-steam plant. Recycling carts should be left out before 7:00 AM on collection day, at the front edge of your property or nominated collection point.

## Yard Waste Collection Rules and Regulations

### Yard waste stickers are available at the Borough office to convert your old blue recycle bin into a container for yard waste disposal.

All residents must participate in the Borough's recycling programs by separating their recyclable material from their regular trash. Yard waste is recyclable; therefore, the separation and collection of this material is mandated by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and Conshohocken Borough.

- Weeds, leaves, brush, and plants should be placed in biodegradable paper composting bags. Please, no trash in these bags.
- Each bag should not be heavier than 50 pounds.
- Tree branches under five (5") in diameter, not exceeding five (5') in length, are to be securely tied into bundles and should not be heaver then 50 pounds.
- Christmas trees. No decorations, tree stands or plastic tree bags.
- Please place your bags, and/or bundles at curbside on your property no earlier than 5:00 PM the night before.

## **Christmas Tree Recycling**

Public Works collects Christmas trees each year following the holiday. Christmas trees should be placed curbside the Tuesday before yard waste collection. The trees are collected, chipped, and composted. All tree bags, ornaments, lights, and stands must be removed.

### **Snow Removal**

Efficient snow removal helps ensure the safety of our residents, visitors, and those traveling through the Borough. When it snows, Public Services makes every effort to clear all Borough and state roads within six (6) to 10 hours after snow has stopped falling. Public Services utilizes a snow management plan that consists of pre-treating roads with a brine solution and plowing during and after a snowstorm. Please refrain from parking on the street if you have off-street parking available.

### Plowing

Residents with off street parking should refrain from parking on the street so that Public Services can clear more of the road. Cones, lawn chairs or other objects used to reserve parking spaces during a snowstorm are prohibited. Public Services will not stop plowing to remove objects used to reserve parking spaces.

### State and Local Roads

Public Services is responsible for plowing all local and state (PennDOT) owned roads, including the Matsonford Bridge and train station cross walks within the Borough of Conshohocken. SEPTA is responsible for clearing snow from the train station and all steps and/ or staircases accessing the train station

## **Declared Snow Emergency**

When the Mayor declares a snow emergency, residents are required to remove their vehicles from any of the Snow Emergency Routes designated below. During a declared snow emergency parking is restricted in these areas and vehicles may be towed.

### **Snow Emergency Routes**

- Fayette Street, both sides from the Conshohocken Borough line to the bridge.
- The south side of Freedley Street from 12th to 11th Avenues.
- Poplar Street from Elm Street to Washington Street.
- East First Ave. (Harry Street to Fayette Street)
- West First Ave. (Fayette Street to Forrest Street)

### **Snow Removal Reminders for Residents**

- Residents should clear their sidewalks after plowing has been completed.
- It is illegal to shovel, throw or plow snow from sidewalks onto street parking, driveways, allies and into the street or right-of way.
- Please use caution while shoveling heavy, deep snow from your property.
- A 3-foot-wide path on the sidewalk must be cleared on your property within 24 hours after the snow has stopped. Don't forget your crosswalks, handicapped ramps, and alley crossing. The Borough does not plow snow in alleys.
- Dumping snow or ice on Borough property or plowing snow across a street is also prohibited.

## **ENVIRONMENTAL ADVISORY COUNCIL**

The Conshohocken Environmental Advisory Council (EAC) is a group of environmentallyconscious community members that promotes sustainability and green practices throughout the Borough through education and events.

For almost a decade, the EAC has hosted Spring and Autumn Community Clean-Ups to help keep our streets looking great while preventing trash from entering stormwater drains and the Schuylkill River. These clean-ups are an excellent way for local families, businesses, churches, sports teams, and other organizations to volunteer together for a good cause that directly impacts where we live. For clean-ups, volunteers are provided the essentials: bags, gloves, and snacks! Keep an eye out for a Community Clean-Up in your part of town.

The EAC also hosts its annual Conshy Greenfest for children and adults to learn about the environmentally friendly practices happening locally. Attendees learn about the many steps the Borough has taken to improve sustainability, protect green open space, and move towards Ready for 100 - a vision of a community powered with 100% clean, renewable energy.

The event is filled with activities that educate children on everything from gardening to global warming. This year's event included an Environmental Art Competition for students from

Conshohocken Elementary. The grand prize winner rode away with a brand-new bike! IKEA was on-site to discuss and display their move toward using sustainable materials in their furniture. REI showed families how to get out and around the modern way with a camping display and free rides on electric bikes.

The EAC holds meetings on the 3rd Thursday of each month at 7 p.m. in Borough Hall. The public is invited to attend these meetings to learn about current initiatives and discuss local environmental topics. ## **LICENSES & INSPECTIONS**

Licenses & Inspections is responsible for the administration and enforcement of Borough ordinances, along with Federal and State building codes. These ordinances may pertain to building, zoning, land development, housing, and property maintenance.

It also responds to citizen complaints concerning property maintenance (lawn maintenance, snow removal, etc.); construction project inspections; apartment inspections; curb and sidewalk inspections, and applications regarding building projects. Licenses & Inspections issues permits for Use and Occupancy, repairs, replacements, additions, and new installations of boilers, roofs, etc.

Licenses & Inspections works closely with the Police Department and the Borough's Fire Marshal in the resolution of health and safety issues as well as residential nuisance complaints on a day-to-day basis.

## **CONSHOHOCKEN FREE LIBRARY**

The Conshohocken Free Library is a nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization. The library's building was originally constructed as a home in 1857 by Lewis Lukens, who "contributed greatly to the commercial, cultural, and civic life of Conshohocken." After his death, his grandchildren gave the house to the Borough of Conshohocken to be used as a library. As their grandfather before them, Lukens' descendants paid it forward to the community, giving them a permanent location to provide opportunities to fulfill the current library mission of providing "lifelong learning for all ages."

Today, the building is the responsibility of the community. We own it and are responsible for its upkeep, which includes routine maintenance, repairs, and improvements. Those decisions are made by the library's advisory board (a group of volunteers listed above), who donate their time and energy to guide decisions on maintaining the building and raise funds to support those efforts. There are many other ways community members can support the library.



## **EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT**

Emergency Management supports the development and implementation of the Borough of Conshohocken's emergency operation plans and standard operating procedures in large-scale incidents and events. Emergency Management exists to support our first responders and all emergency personnel. The department consists of Police, Fire, EMS, Borough Administration, and Public Services personnel, in combination with our Borough Council.

Our biggest overall objective is to prepare the community for large-scale emergency situations.

Emergency preparedness can start with you. Disasters can strike without warning, forcing you to go for days without necessities or to evacuate your home. Relief workers will be on-scene following a disaster but may not be able to reach you immediately.

Creating a plan and knowing the steps to take during a disaster can greatly reduce the danger and distress your family may face. Your emergency plan should accommodate any unique needs related to family, pets, infants, children, and any family members with health, disability, or mobility concerns.

If there is an emergency in our area, you might not be able to get food, water, and other necessities you need. That is why a key action for preparedness is to make an emergency supply kit and keep it readily available in your home.

The Borough of Conshohocken has an Emergency Preparedness Guide to assist you in creating your Emergency Plan. This can be found on our website under Departments | Emergency Management. Here you will also find the link to sign up for the Borough's Emergency Alert System, CodeRED, as well as the link to monitor the USGS Flood Gauge on the Matsonford Bridge.




